## **ACFD Governance**

- ACFD is a dependent fire district formed under the Fire Protection
   District Law of 1987 and governed by the County Board of
   Supervisors as the Fire District's Board of Directors
- ACFD receives no County general fund revenue, Prop 172 funds, utility user, or business license tax funds
- 11 Member Fire Advisory Commission comprised of six Board appointed members and five city council members
- ACFD complies and adheres to established County of Alameda policies and procedures for fiscal, human resources, and programmatic functions




# ACFD Governance (cont.)

- Oversight from County Administrator's Office, Auditor-Controller's Office, and Executive Management Oversight Committee
- Service levels are determined by Board of Directors and individual contract agencies
- ACFD provides performance-based fire and emergency services to contract agencies





# TOTAL APPROPRIATION BY MAJOR OBJECT



## TOTAL REVENUE BY SOURCE



## FIRE REVENUE BY SOURCE


**Total Revenues: \$151.07M**

## FY 2020-21 Year in Review

- Responded to 42,363 incidents in FY 2019-20
- ACRECC processed 314,692 calls in FY 2019-20
- ACFD conducted 8,915 fire inspections
- Completed 2020 Firefighter Recruit Academy with 16 graduates
- Approval of \$30M Fire Training Center Project, a 5-acre site located in Dublin in the vicinity of ACFD Station 17.
- Approval of \$90M Fire Safety Bond to repair, upgrade and replace outdated fire stations in unincorporated Alameda County.
- Approval of 5-year fire and emergency response services contracts with the cities of Newark and Union City



## FY 2020-21 Year in Review

- Implemented the COVID-19 Prevention Program as mandated by Federal and State requirements
- ❖ Assisted HCSA with COVID-19 testing at various locations in Alameda County
- Facilitated distribution of COVID-19 vaccinations at various county locations
- Collaborated with ACSO, other fire agencies in the region, and Cal FIRE during the SCU Lightning Complex Fire incident, 3rd largest fire in State history
- Completed the Back Up Dispatch Center for Alameda County Regional Communication Center at Fire Station 23
