## **County Service Areas / Districts**

#### **Fee Increases**

- Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Special District increase of \$1.85 per benefit unit based on Bay Area Consumer Price Index (CPI).
- Paramedic Supplemental Tax increase of \$0.98 per benefit unit based on Bay Area CPI.
- Vector Control Services District increase of \$0.93 per benefit unit.

#### No Change in Fees

- Healthy Homes Department Lead Poisoning Prevention Program
- Public Works Agency-administered Castlewood, Five Canyons, Castle Homes, and Street Lighting County Service Areas



## **Board Member Policy Directives**

#### Foster Care Guaranteed Income Pilot

- Supervisors Brown & Haubert
- •2-year guaranteed income pilot to serve 90 former foster youth
- •Total cost of \$2.8M over 3 Fiscal Years (FY) beginning FY 2022-23
- •FY 2022-23 funding to be \$0.7M and to be within Social Services Agency's Proposed Budget
- •Staff to identify \$1.4M for FY 2023-24 and \$0.7M for FY 2024-25
- Staff to contract with Bay Area Community Services to administer and seek philanthropic/ State support to support additional cohorts.

## Housing Bond & Healthy Homes Expansion

- Supervisor Miley
- •Direct the County Administrator (CAO) to analyze and report back to the Board on two potential ballot initiatives:
- Initiative 1 the renewal of the Measure A1 General Obligation Bond to support affordable housing Countywide
- Initiative 2 the expansion of jurisdictional boundaries of the Healthy Homes Joint Powers Authority and a potential increase in the assessment.

#### Behavioral Health Care Funding & Policy Review

- Supervisor Miley
- •CAO to review and identify potential funding sources to support proposals related to Behavioral Health and report back to the Board:
- •Proposal 1 Full implementation of the Forensic System Redesign Plan with a cost of \$50.6M.
- •Proposal 2 Bed buy-back at Villa Fairmont Mental Health Rehabilitation Center.
- Proposal 3 Increase individuals served by Full Service Partnerships
- Proposal 4 New funding to support implementation of CARE Court.

#### West Oakland Food Hub

- Supervisor Carson
- Direct the Social Services Agency and Health Care Services Agency to identify \$3.5M within existing resources to fund development of a West Oakland Food Hub in partnership with Impact Oakland NOW (ION).
- •The funds will be to retrofit an existing warehouse to provide at least 5 commercial kitchens, 2,000sq ft of refrigerator / freezer space, food processing space, and a staging area for a fleet of 5-7 electric, refrigerated vans/trucks.



## Policy Directive – Guaranteed Income Pilot Foster Youth

- Submitted by Supervisors Brown & Haubert
- 2-year Guaranteed Income for Former Foster Youth (GIFFY) pilot program:
  - Begins January 2023
  - Serves approximately 90 youth formerly in Alameda County foster care
  - \$1,000 monthly payment per participant
- Fiscal Year 2022-23 cost of \$700,000 to come from funding within the Social Services
  Agency Proposed Budget
- Fiscal Year 2023-24 cost of \$1,400,000 and FY 2024-25 cost of \$700,000 to be identified by staff
- Funding would include a contract with Bay Area Community Services to administer the pilot and seek additional State and philanthropic funding



## Policy Directive – Affordable Housing Bond & Healthy Homes Expansion

- Submitted by Supervisor Miley
- Directs the County Administrator to analyze and report back to the Board regarding two potential ballot initiatives:
  - Renewal of a general obligation bond to support affordable housing countywide; and
  - Increased assessment and expanded jurisdiction for the Healthy Homes
    Program Joint Powers Authority



### Policy Directive – Review & Funding Identification for Behavioral Health

- Submitted by Supervisor Miley
- Directs the County Administrator to review and identify potential funding sources to support proposals related to Health Care Services Agency / Behavioral Health Care Department initiatives:
  - Implement its full Forensic System Redesign Plan (\$50.67 million);
  - Purchase treatment beds at Villa Fairmont Mental Health Rehabilitation Center;
  - Increase individuals served by Full Service Partnerships
  - Support implementation of the Governor's CARE Court program



### **Policy Directive – West Oakland Food Hub**

- Submitted by Supervisor Carson
- Direct the Social Services Agency and Health Care Services Agency to identify \$3.5M within existing resources to fund development of a West Oakland Food Hub in partnership with Impact Oakland NOW (ION).
- The funds will be to retrofit an existing warehouse to provide at least 5 commercial kitchens, 2,000sq ft of refrigerator / freezer space, food processing space, and a staging area for a fleet of 5-7 electric, refrigerated vans/trucks.
