DUTIES OF THE SHERIFF



Legislative duties of the Sheriff:

Government Code - Section 26600-26607

- The Sheriff shall PRESERVE THE PEACE, may participate in CRIME PREVENTION and REHABILITATION
- ARREST all persons who attempt or commit public OFFENSES
- Be the AUTHORITY to keep the COUNTY JAIL
- SERVE all PROCESS and NOTICES in the manner prescribed by law

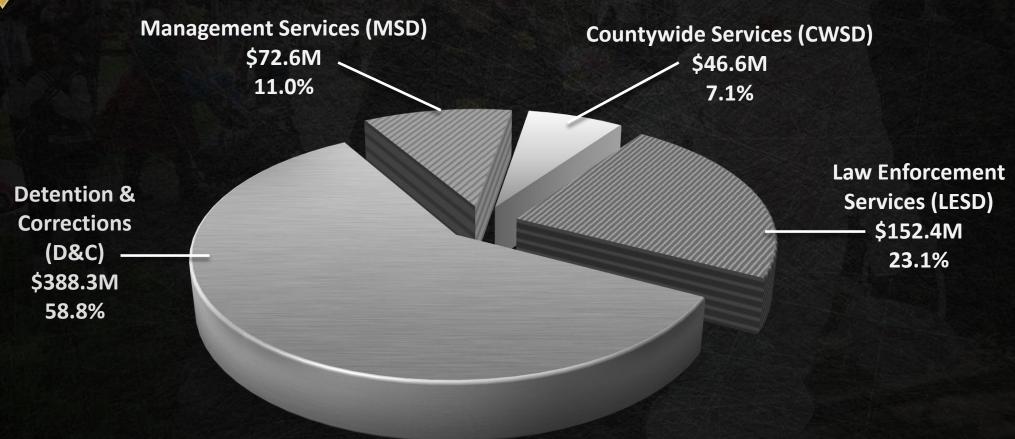

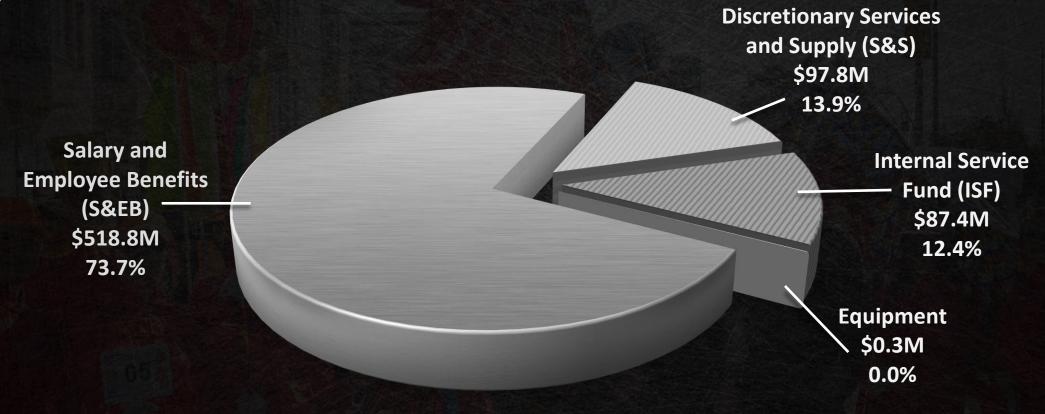


2025-2026 APPROPRIATION BY DIVISION





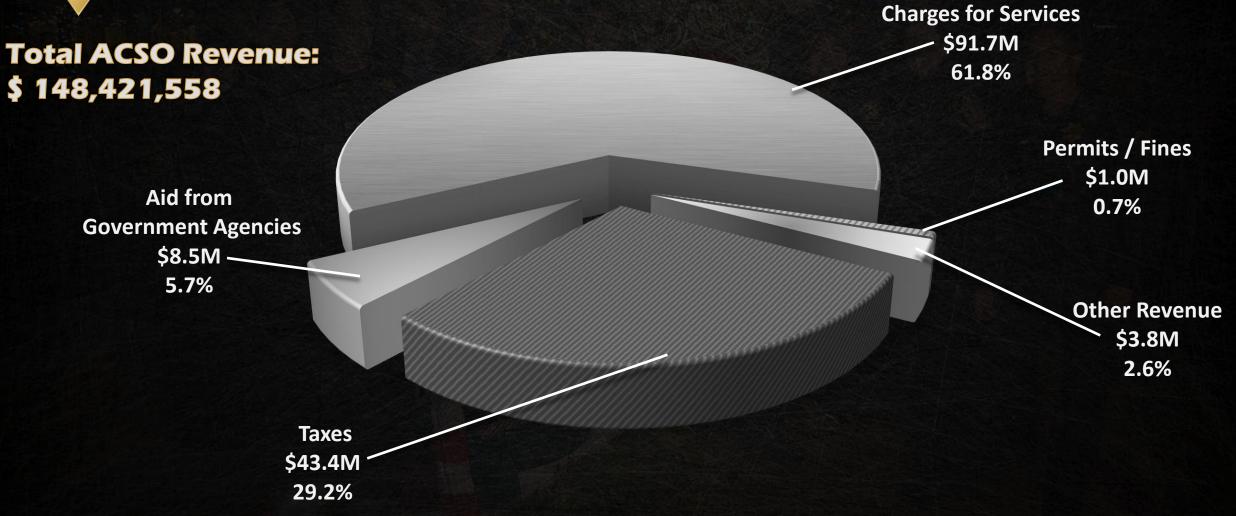
2025-2026 APPROPRIATION BY MAJOR OBJECT

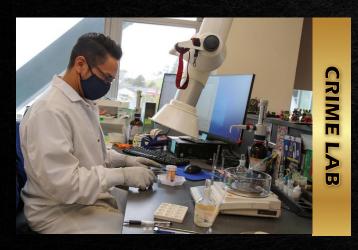

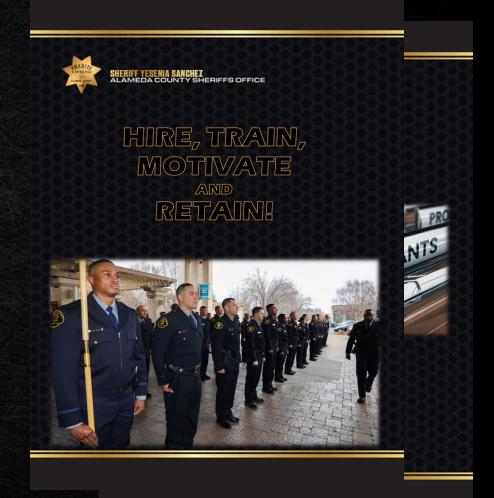

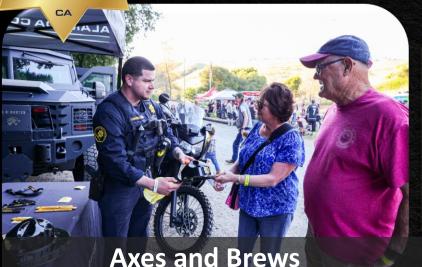
